

Finding Full Text Access to Journal Articles

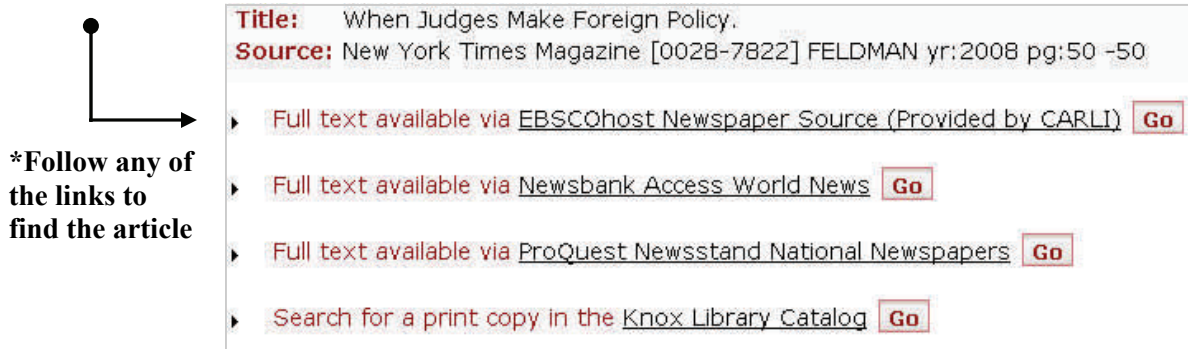


When you are searching in any of the Knox databases, use the Find It! button to search for full text access to an article. The Find It! button will search all of the databases Knox subscribes to at once to see if full text is available.

In the database, click on the Find It! button next to the article you are interested in.



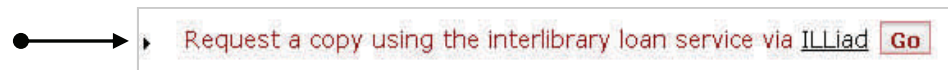
A new tab or window will open and show you if full text is available in any of the databases.



If there are no links to full text access, search the Knox Library Catalog to see if the library has a print subscription to the journal.



If there is no print subscription, submit an ILLiad request to get the article.



If you have never used the ILLiad service before, you will need to set-up an account. Click on [First Time User](#) and follow the instructions (this is not associated with your Knox library account or IShare account). ILLiad requests usually take around a week to arrive.

Finding Full Text Access when you have a citation

When you have a complete citation, you can search all of the databases at once for full text access to the article by using **Find Journals Online** located on the library homepage.



On the Find Journals Online page, **search for the journal title**.



If the journal is in any of the databases Knox subscribes to, it will be listed here. Notice the date range listed below each database. Make sure that the date of your article is within the date range



If the journal is not listed in Find Journal Online, search the **Knox Catalog** to see if the library has a print subscription. If the journal is not listed in Find Journals Online or in the Knox Catalog, you will have to request the article through the **ILLiad Service**.
