

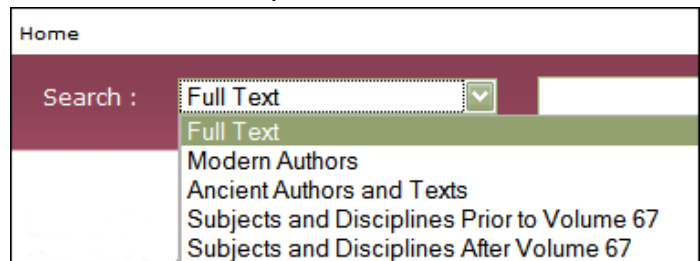


L'Année Philologique is the premier online database for classical studies research. This database indexes over 1,500 international periodicals, published anthologies, and conference proceedings.

Search Options:

Full text: Conduct a keyword search here. The system looks for the keywords in the author, article title, journal name, and abstract (if available).

Modern authors: Search here for articles written by modern authors about classical studies. Enter the author's last name and select the author's full name from the list.



Ancient authors and text: Search for articles about ancient authors. Like the modern author search, start with only the last name select the author's full name from the list. For ancient authors and texts, L'Année uses the Latin form (Homerus, for instance), but well-established names in English are also recognized (Homer, for instance).

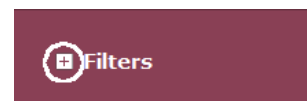
Subjects and Disciplines (prior to and after vol. 67): Use this search to browse the subject categories that correspond to the printed version of L'Année Philologique. Choose a subject category from the list to retrieve all entries assigned to that category.

Search Tips:

❖ For more search options click on the **“Advanced Search”** link. Additional useful search options include:

- Word(s) of the title -- use for more precise results
- Journal title
- Reviews by journal title
- Reviews by author

❖ On the Advanced Search page, click the plus symbol (+) next to **“Filters”** to view options for limiting your search. Since L'Année Philologique is an international database covering journals in multiple languages other than English, it is useful to **limit your search to English language publications** here.



❖ The Wildcard Character is **“%”**. Use it to search for terms with variant endings, e.g., **“slav%”** retrieves records with any of the terms: slave, slaves, slavery.

❖ Multiple terms entered in the search box are processed as a Boolean AND by default.

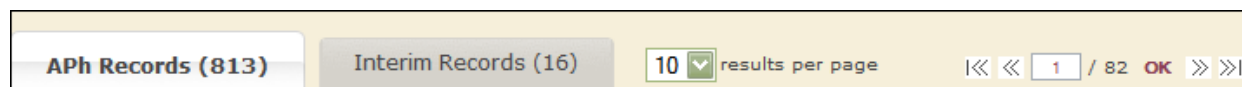
Viewing Results:

Click on a title in the results list to view the full record. Records may or may not include abstracts. L'Année Philologique displays journal titles in the record as abbreviations. To see the full journal title in a record, mouse-over the abbreviated title.

Results lists are often displayed in two parts: “Aph Records” and “Interim Records.” Look at the tabs at the top of the results list:



“Aph Records” are displayed by default. **Interim records** are the latest available records--the most recent scholarship--prior to publication in the print version of L'Année Philologique and separated in the database prior to the annual update of the database. Click on the “Interim Records” tab to view this additional set of records.
